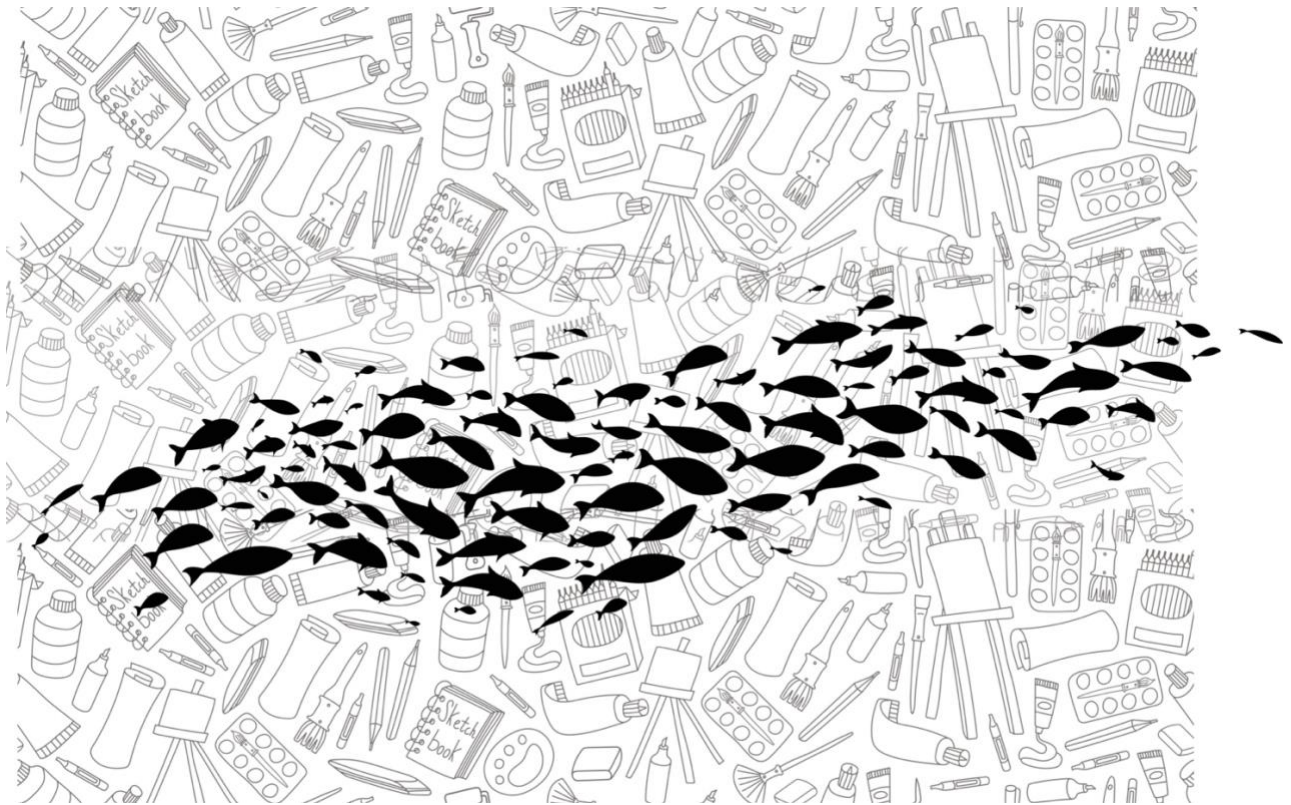




THE TWILIGHT OF THE ART SCHOOL
